Iowa's Native Trees and Shrubs

What is a Native Tree or Shrub?

A **native** tree or shrub species occurs naturally in Iowa. Most landscape plants are grown in other parts of the country and shipped to Iowa every spring.

Why Plant Natives?

Native trees/shrubs...

- are better adapted to Iowa's extremes in weather and planting sites.
- provide superior habitat for native wildlife.
- evolved with local insect and disease pests, so can resist them better.
- usually are less invasive.
- are a link to Iowa's Heritage.

Look for trees and shrubs native to Iowa the next time you purchase landscape plants.
